Portfolio: Awards committee

There is nothing to report for this period. All awards and medals were awarded during the recent congress held in East London. A new awards committee will be put together in time to consider the existing guidelines for awards and medals, and the new members will be communicated to Council once members have confirmed their participation.

Portfolio: Science & Education Committee

Our goal is to ensure that high standards of education, research, technology, and science-based public policy are upheld regarding animal production and animal products.

One of the main roles of this committee will be to identify the scientific needs and requirements of both academia and the animal science industry. In terms of academia, the primary focus area will be the standardization of the quality of education presented across all South African universities that offer animal science curricula. In terms of industry, the primary focus will be to increase the involvement of SASAS in the industry (e.g. through the inclusion of more industry-focused opportunities). Full-rounded animal science graduates must be produced from academia who are not only academically strong but also have the skills and capabilities to thrive in the industry and is of importance to the subcommittee to therefore strengthen the "link" between academia and industry.

One of the main challenges that the committee will have to tackle, which pertains to both academia and industry, is to continue to engage with SACNASP on the Day-One Compliance (DOC) document set up with the South African Veterinary Council (SAVC). The listed DOCs will be considered by SACNASP in future to award candidate or professional registration. Because SACNASP is a governing body (that protects Animal Scientists), it is the responsibility of the council (and specifically this subcommittee) to keep these conversations going (and put onto paper the Animal Science "defense") to prevent certain on-farm practices and animal-related jobs from becoming restricted to only vets.

The subcommittee will furthermore seek to liaise with the Limpopo local organizing committee (LOC) on the scientific program of the upcoming 2025 congress. Lastly, the possibility of monthly CPD-registered webinar sessions, and the potential topics and speakers (local and international from both academic and industry backgrounds), are also being discussed and planned.

Portfolio: Professional Development Committee

The following will be the main actions of the committee:

- Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Our aim is to a drive to inform and guide the members to make sure that they commit to keeping their CPD points up to date and comply with regulations.
- Drive the mentorship program for CPD and candidate professional animal scientists.
- Manage all CPD events that require uploading on continuous basis.
- Manage education matters that relate to CPD activities.
- Update and revise documentation relevant to the Animal Science profession. Current members and future members need
 to understand what it entails to be a professional animal scientist, who qualifies and also make the differentiation of
 categories of registration clearer.
- Liaise with affiliated organizations and societies, such as the WPSA, AFMA, Wildlife Association, South African Veterinary
 Association, GSSA and other relevant Associations that have animal scientist working in the field of animal sciences and
 get the support to motivate their members to join SASAS and SACNASP and the registering of symposia, technical
 workshops and conferences for members to earn CPD points.
- · Protection of professionalism in animal science.

Portfolio: Student affairs and branches

The mission of the SASAS branches is to advance the animal science profession. All SASAS branches operate under the auspices of the Society and execute the Society's aims by hosting region-specific activities. The branches are important in promoting associations between members, students, and industry. For the last few years, most branches have only been active in their congress year which has been a concern, however, most regional branches have been reinvigorated with newly elected and committed members. We are in the process of setting minimum activity goals which each branch will need to adhere to over a two-year cycle. These goals will consist of student-focused and industry-focused activities. The goal is to bridge the gap between academia and industry, create more opportunities for students to connect with industry professionals, and ensure that there is regular contact with members.

There are five branches and their chairpersons are, the Eastern Cape (Sindisile Goni), Free State (Dr Foch-Henry de Witt), KwaZulu Natal (Dr Nomfuzo Mkhize), Northern (Karla Zietsman), and Western Cape (Dr Pfunzo Muvhali) branches. If you wish to become more involved in SASAS, please reach out to the branch that represents your area - details will be shared on the Facebook page and in an email from SASAS secretariat.

Students are the future and to ensure SASAS's future, we need to get the students involved. The Student Affairs portfolio has been created and aims to educate students on what the animal science profession entails, to help students connect with industry professionals, and to get students involved in SASAS activities. The subcommittee will consist of one representative from every university in South Africa that presents animal science. The Student Affairs subcommittee plans to collaborate with the Branches subcommittee and main council to organise a SASAS roadshow. During the roadshow members from the main council and that region's branch will talk to undergraduate students about animal science and SASAS. We also plan to increase interaction between universities and industry by collaborating with the Scientific and Education subcommittee in organizing webinars where postgraduate students and invited industry speakers present and discuss specific animal science topics. It was suggested that each university create its own student SASAS branch – a type of student representative council if you will – to encourage students to assist in planning SASAS activities and spreading the word of animal science to schools.
